Moses Says

What You Need: No supplies are needed.

What You Do: Play "Moses Says," a variation of the game "Simon Says." Have the children stand facing you. Do an action such as patting your head, rubbing your tummy, or hopping on one foot. Be sure to say "Moses says" before doing the action. Do three or more of these actions making sure to say "Moses Says" before doing the action. Then mix it up and do an action without saying "Moses Says" beforehand. Watch for the children who do the action and then ask them to sit down. Keep playing until you have one child standing. Repeat the game until the children lose interest.

(Note: Depending on the age of the children, you may not want to make somebody sit out. Instead, you could just play and all giggle together when someone messes up.)

What You Sav:

At the start of the activity: "Let's play a game! Have any of you ever played the game 'Simon Says' before? Okay, this game is just like it. This game is about using your ears to listen and follow directions. When I say "Moses says," you do what I do. But If I do not say "Moses says" then you do not do what I do. Does everyone understand? (Pause for responses.) Great! Let's get started."

At the end of the activity: "You all did a great job following directions. Did you know that God gives us directions too? He does! Today in our story, we learned about how God gave people directions. God gave Moses ten rules, called "Commandments" the rules showed God's people how to live, and how to be close to him, and how to be happy. They showed how life worked best. God gave us rules so that we can know him. I can know God by learning his laws.

Rules of the Road

What You Need: Pictures of Traffic Signs

What You Do: There are two kinds of signs: Ones with matching words and ones without matching words. The two different kinds of signs are separated into two different manila folders. Divide the children into two teams (3 teams if there are enough adults. You will have to further divide the signs with matching words if there are 3 adults). Group 1: Spread out the signs so that all the children in your group can see them. Keep the corresponding words for each sign. Hold up one word picture at a time and have the children find the matching traffic sign. Talk about what each sign means. Group 2: Spread out the signs so all the children in your group can see them. Have the children identify what each sign means. Group 1 & 2: Discuss how important it is to follow rules of the road and the consequences.

Freeze Dance

What You Need: Go and Stop Signs, CD Player and Music

What You Do: Have the children gather around in one area. Play fun music for the children to dance to. The children should continue dancing as long as you are holding up the green sign. Once you switch the green sign for the red sign, the children should immediately stop dancing and freeze. Children should start dancing again when you switch back to the green sign.
