Theme: Zapped – Plugging into God's power helps me see and do what I should.

Bible Story: Calling of Peter (Luke 5:1-11)

Bottom Line: God wants to do something with me that's bigger than just me.

Memory Verse: God's power has given us everything we need to lead a godly life. (2 Peter

1:3a NIrV)

Video: Countdown Video

Host enters holding a Video Game Remote.

SFX: Greeter Theme

HOST: Do any of you have that video game that you just can't beat? Which one is it? Come on, yell it out. (*Pause for responses.*) Yeah! Me too. In fact, there is one game that I have that I am just terrible at, it seems like I can't score a single point.

I am not kidding here, I will sit in front of the TV for hours. Sometimes, I will stay in front of it all night long and will not score a single point. Shhhhh—don't tell my parents I was up all night, I know none of you ever stay up all night. (Host winks at audience.) I have tried everything to score points on this game and I have no luck.

SFX - Old Video Game Sounds

(Host begins to mimic motions with the remote) I have tried going left, going right, going up, going down, going back, going forward. (At this point, Host is jumping all over the stage with these moves). Still, nothing. I was so discouraged.

Then, one night my cell phone rang at 2:00 a.m. in the morning. It was my friend. I was like: "What are you calling me at 2:00 in the morning for?" He said, "You still playing that game that you play all the time and you are terrible at?" I said, "Of course I am!" He told me then to sit still, he would be right over. I thought he was crazy. This was going to be a total waste of time. I have been trying to rack up points at this game for months and have gotten nowhere. What did my friend know that I didn't?

Well, he came over and sat right next to me on the couch. He told me he was an expert, and he was going to help me with this game. So, sure enough, after a short period of time, he began to rack up points. I screamed "LET ME TRY!" I watched what he was doing and, sure enough, I—

SFX - Old Video Game Sounds

(Host begins to mimic motions with the remote.) Was going left, going right, going up, going down, going back, going forward. (At this point, Host is jumping all over the stage with these moves). I had finally gotten it! Not only did I begin to score points but I was racking them up left and right, I had made it to the top of the leaderboard! I had done it.

In the beginning, I thought this would be a total waste of time, but it ended up being close to a miracle. Today, you will hear a story about a man who had a similar problem. His was about fish. Until then, you are looking at the champion!

"Speaking of games, let's play a game to connect with each other right now. Our ZAPPED game today is called, Circles. (Explain game)

ZAPPED GAME: Circles

What You Do:

- Play an elimination game where the kids gather in circles of a certain number of people who have one thing in common.
- You will call out a number and then the thing in common. Then kids will scramble to get into those specific groups.
- For example:
 - "Circles of three people who have noses!" (In this example everyone would be involved because everyone has a nose!)
 - All the kids (with noses) would form circles of three and join hands with the people in their group.
 - No more than three and no less. Anyone left out of the circles is out for that round.
- Keep calling out different numbers of people in circles and different common qualities. The qualities should not always involve everyone. For example: "Circles of two with blonde hair!" Only those with blonde hair would have to get in circles. Everyone else is safe.
- Here are some examples of qualities to call out: blue shirts, wearing jeans, wearing a
 dress, has glasses, wearing clothes, in second grade (or third grade), eight years old, is
 at Parkview has hair, etc.

SFX: "Wrap up Theme" Play music under the Host's monologue as he speaks to the audience.
