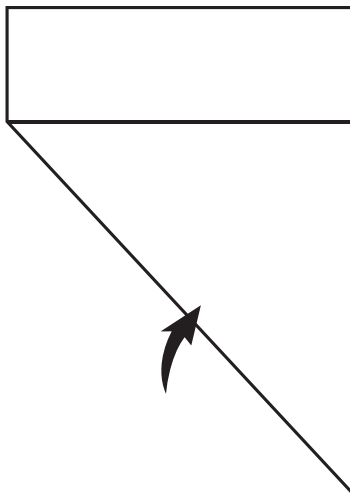
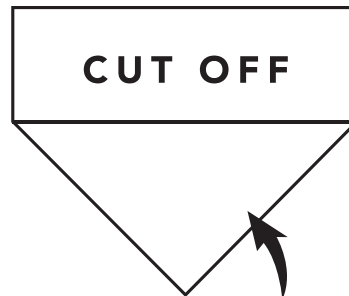


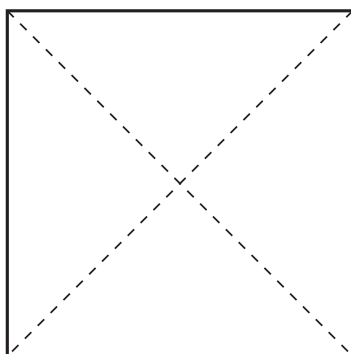
1 Get a sheet of paper.



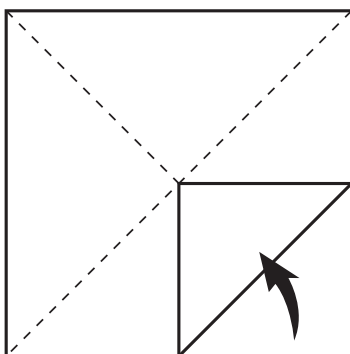
2 Fold a corner so it meets the other side.



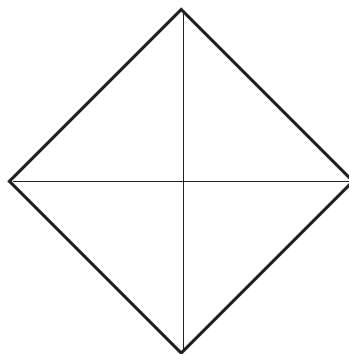
3 Fold other corner and cut off the top.



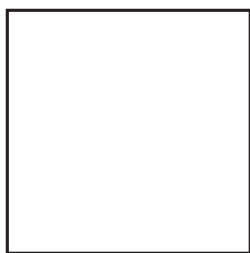
4 Unfold the paper. It's square now.



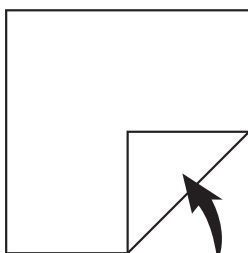
5 Fold the corners back so the points meet...



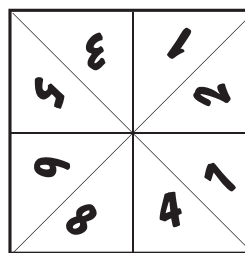
6 ...and it'll look like this. Then...



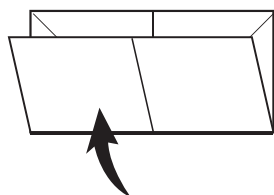
7 Flip it over. It looks like this now.



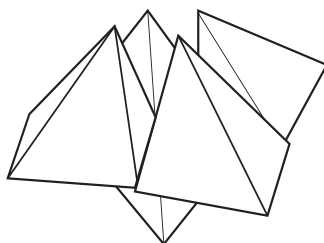
8 Again, fold the corners so the points meet...



9 ...and now it'll look like this. Write one number (1-8) on each of the triangles. The numbers do not have to be in order.



10 Fold it and work your fingers into it.



11 Push the creases out into four points.
