There are two parts to wisdom. The first part is finding out what you should do. You might talk to God. You might read your Bible to see what God says in His Word. You might talk to someone further along in his or her walk with God that can point you in the right direction. However you do it, God wants you to search for His will.

The second part is just as important as the first! Once you have figured out what God wants you to do in a situation, you should do it. If you know what God wants from you, but choose not to do it, that is showing the opposite of wisdom: foolishness.

ASK GOD TO HELP YOU UNDERSTAND WHAT TO DO AND THEN TO HAVE COURAGE TO DO WHAT HE IS ASKING!

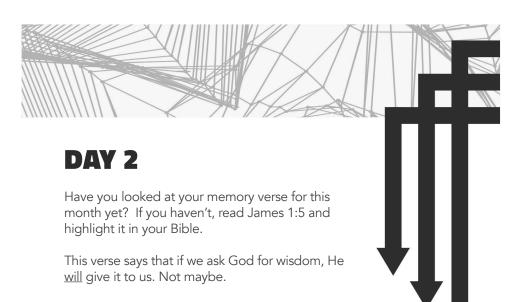

Start today. What is happening this week that you may need wisdom? Get alone with God and ask Him to give you wisdom in all situations this week, especially the tough ones.



Ride your bike around your neighborhood and find the tallest tree you can. Then, look at that tree's roots. The taller the tree, the bigger and deeper the roots must be in the ground. Just like strong and tall trees, the more we want to grow in wisdom, the more deeply rooted in God's Word we must be.
