

NOTE: In place of traditional Small Groups, you/other Leaders will be leading all together activities with your students from this Sheet. Leader should dispense hand sanitizer to each student and themselves. Pens and other items touched by kids need to be replaced each service. Feel free to alternate activities with other Leaders in the Room as necessary. The more Leaders that the kids hear from, the better!

ALLEY All Together Activities:

The below activities will be done all together with EVERYONE, and led from the Front of your Room. Leaders can alternate leading the below activities as necessary.

1. Just for Fun

What You Need: Index Cards (2 per student), Pens (1 per student)

What You Do:

- **Gather** kids in a circle.
- **Give** each kid two index cards and a pen.
- **Tell** kids to write a truth about themselves on one index card, such as I have a pet monkey or I can floss dance.
 - **Be sure** kids don't reveal their cards to each other.
 - **Encourage** them to think of something most people don't know about them.
- **Tell** kids to write a "lie" about themselves on the other index card, such as I'm allergic to mustard or I can burp the alphabet.
- **Tell** kids you are going to go around the circle and kids can either tell the Truth or the Lie about themselves. Have the other students vote accordingly.
- Once everyone has had a turn, **talk** about the cards and get some stories from your group.
 - **Allow** kids time to connect with one another.
 - **Continue** to Activity 2 when the discussion seems completed.

2. Get Your Head in the Game

What You Need: Set of 3 Ping Pong Balls (red, yellow and green-per service) 3 Solo Cups (per service)

What You Do:

- **Gather** kids in a physically distanced fashion in view of your Small Group Table.
- **Place** one Ping Pong Ball under 1 Solo Cup, instructing students to pay attention to where each ball is in regards to their color.
- **Scramble** the cups up as much as you'd like.
- **Tell** kids to not make any suggestions of where each ball is.
- **Allow** kids to raise their hands and guess which cup has which ball.
- **Play** several rounds.

What You Say:

"In our daily lives there are a lot of things we shouldn't hide. In our talk today, we learned that there are no secrets with God. He is above all, and He sees all. How cool is it to know that we can be truthful with God because He already knows everything about us! There are no secrets with God!"

3. Take a Snapshot

What You Need: Don't Say It Cards (1 game per Campus), Smartphone Timer

What You Do:

- **Pick** a student to be the first Clue Giver and give them a stack of cards
- **The rest** of the students are the Guessers
- **The Clue Giver** gets one minute to get the guessers to say the words, without using the forbidden words on card. They keep pulling cards until the minute is up.
- **Switch** Clue Givers for each round.
- **Continue** playing until everyone gets a chance to be the Clue Giver, or leader calls time.

4. Discussion Questions

- What do you usually talk to God about? What do you pray about?
- How does talking to God affect your relationship with Him? (To spark discussion, **ask**: how does talking to your friend affect your relationship with them? What would happen if you decided to ignore your friend?)
- When is it hard to talk to God? Why can it be hard to talk to God?
- Is there anything we can hide from God? If God knows everything, why talk to Him?
