## CG: *Dude Perfect Filler Videos*

“Hey, everyone! Looks like you’ve been having a great morning so far. I loved seeing all of those gifts being shared, even if some of them were . . . not so great.

“In the spirit of gifts and giving, let me ask you—and be honest now—how many of you would say you enjoy giving gifts more than you enjoy receiving gifts? Anyone? (notice response) Ok, a few of you. That’s great. I mean, there’s something fun about picking out or even making a gift for someone, something that maybe they didn’t even think about for themselves, and then seeing their face when they finally open it. It is pretty cool, right? Maybe someone has done that for you?”

*Tell a personal story of a time when someone gave you a gift that you were not expecting and it really surprised you (in a good way), or when you did that for somebody else. Something like the following story. Optional: Use this story as a hypothetical situation.*

I remember this one Christmas when I was in sixth grade. All I wanted was a Walkman . . . think of it like a really early version of listening to music on your smart phone—except it didn’t make phone calls, take photos, connect to the internet, or anything other than play one cassette tape full of music at a time, though some could connect to radio stations. But since we didn’t have smart phones or iPods or iPads, this was it. And I wanted one, and not just any Walkman. I wanted the Sony Sport, Waterproof, bright yellow Walkman with in-ear headphones. But I never thought my parents would get it for me. Honestly, I was just hoping for a simple Walkman of my own. By now, I’m sure you know where this is going, but . . . Christmas morning, under the tree was a present with my name on it. I tore into it, and yes! My parents surprised me with the Sony Sport! I spent the rest of the day listening to all of my cassette tapes. Best. Christmas. Ever!

“But let’s get serious for a moment. As great as that Christmas was, would it have still been great if my parents had only been able to get me a simple Walkman or didn’t get me a Walkman at all? Of course, you probably only give gifts that people love! But truth be told, we don’t always get what we asked for, or sometimes we give something the person already had, and sometimes even the gifts we absolutely LOVE on Christmas morning get lost under the bed or in a closet the next month. Too often I think this happens with the BEST gift that any of us has been given—Jesus.

“We take a whole month to celebrate that Jesus came. We have holidays that help us remember that Jesus came to make a way for us to be with God forever. We think about that gift during certain times of year or maybe on Sundays when we come to church. But how can we make a habit of remembering God’s Big Give when Jesus came?

“That’s a great question! Maybe it’s one you’ve thought about before, or maybe you’ve never wondered that. And that’s okay, too. With Christmas a week away, today is a great time for us to think about questions like this. And like we say at a lot around here, when we have questions, the Bible is a great place for us to start to find some answers—especially when it comes to our questions about Jesus! Let’s head there now and unwrap some answers . . . with the help of this week’s Episode.”

## CG: *Lesson Video (Runtime: 13:00)*

“This was the first Christmas. Jesus is God’s one and only Son, and God sent Him into this messy world to save us. There may be some pretty cool gifts you receive this next week, but make no mistake . . . THIS is how God gave us the GREATEST gift ever.
